

REV. DR. JOANNE PEPPARD-COOKE DOCTORAL GRANT

The Reverend Dr. Joanne Peppard-Cooke Doctoral Grant Fund was established by Dr. Cooke in 2003. The primary purpose of the fund is to provide financial support to women doctoral candidates in the Educational Administration and Foundations Department to assist with expenses associated with the completion of the doctoral dissertation and graduation.

Candidate Qualifications

Each candidate for a Rev. Dr. Joanne Peppard-Cooke doctoral grant must:

- Be a female graduate student in the Department of Educational Administration and Foundations who has completed her dissertation proposal and all coursework related to the doctoral program
- Plan to complete her dissertation and graduate within two years of receiving the grant
- Submit a written recommendation from at least one faculty member who is familiar with the candidate's interests and performance to the dean of the College of Education or be nominated by the dean
- Demonstrate financial need
